Be a Draft Detective! (part 1)

Create A Draft Catcher

As a draft detective you can make a simple device to detect drafts around the house. Once you put together a simple draft catcher, watch to see if the tissue paper flutters, indicating air flow and a draft. This device is easy to make and can be decorated however you'd like!

Materials (for each draft catcher)

- 1 paint stirrer (a pencil, popsicle stick or skewer may also be used)
- 1 piece of tissue paper
- Tape, glue stick, or other adhesive
- Markers, for decoration

After you detect a draft you can stop it with a draft stopper.

Instructions

- 1. Decorate your paint stirrer any way you'd like. Drawing on them with markers can really make these catchers snazzy!
- 2. Attach a piece of tissue paper to the stirrer using glue or tape
- 3. Explore your house or school to find drafts. When the catcher flutters, a draft may be present
